A trust-wide model for Citizenship, PSHE,
safeguarding and values education

1. Introduction: Why Schools Need a Coherent Ecosystem

Schools and MATs are navigating a period of rising complexity: political polarisation, online misinformation, identity-based tensions, and increasing expectations around safeguarding, behaviour, and Personal Development. Yet the systems designed to respond to these pressures, Citizenship, PSHE, behaviour policies, tutor time, assemblies, and safeguarding, often operate in isolation.

This fragmentation leaves staff uncertain, pupils confused, and leaders without a clear, trust-wide narrative that connects values, knowledge, and behaviour.

The InclusiveEd Ecosystem provides a coherent, human-centred solution. It brings together four essential pillars; **Human Stories**, **Real-World Complexity**, **Democratic Literacy**, and **Strategic Coherence**, to create a calm, connected approach that strengthens curriculum intent, staff confidence, and whole-school culture.

Instead of treating Citizenship, PSHE, values, behaviour, and safeguarding as separate domains, the ecosystem aligns them into one shared message: we listen, we think, we question, we debate, and we treat each other with dignity and fairness.

This integrated model gives MATs what they currently lack, a unified framework that prepares pupils for democratic life, reduces risk, and ensures every child experience a consistent, rights-based education.

2. The Four Pillars of the InclusiveEd Ecosystem

Pillar 1: Human Stories

Grounds learning in identity, values, empathy, and lived experience. Through narrative resources such as Web of Lives, values cards, ideological thinkers, and assemblies, pupils explore who they are, what they believe, and how their experiences shape their perspectives. This builds emotional intelligence, dignity, and respect, the conditions for safe, meaningful dialogue.

Pillar 2: Real-World Complexity

Connects values to real issues: rights, discrimination, digital life, ethical dilemmas, and contemporary challenges. This ensures PSHE, tutor time, English oracy, and assemblies reinforce the same core messages. Pupils learn to navigate complexity with confidence, fairness, and personal accountability.

Pillar 3: Democratic Literacy

Delivered through the InclusiveEd Citizenship Spine, this pillar provides a clear KS3–4 progression in democracy, law, rights, media literacy, political systems, and respectful debate. It supports specialists and non-specialists alike, ensuring every pupil receives a high-quality democratic education.

Pillar 4: Strategic Coherence

Aligns curriculum, behaviour, safeguarding, and school policy so pupils experience a consistent message across the school day. It reduces risk, strengthens staff confidence, and ensures that values are not abstract ideals but lived expectations.

3. How the Pillars Work Together

The strength of the ecosystem lies in the way the four pillars interlock. Pupils begin with **Human Stories**, exploring identity and values in a way that builds empathy and emotional intelligence.

These values are applied to **Real-World Complexity**, where pupils connect their understanding to contemporary issues, rights, digital life, and ethical dilemmas.

This prepares them for **Democratic Literacy**, where structured knowledge of democracy, law, rights, and media literacy gives them the confidence to debate without defensiveness.

Strategic Coherence ensures that the same expectations, dignity, fairness, accountability, respectful dialogue, are reflected in behaviour policies, restorative practice, safeguarding procedures, and staff routines.

Together, these pillars create a school environment where pupils learn not only what to think, but how to think: how to listen actively, challenge ideas without attacking people, understand different perspectives, and participate confidently in democratic life.

4. The Citizenship Spine (Overview)

The Citizenship Spine provides the structured knowledge and progression that underpin the ecosystem. It offers a clear KS3 - 4 pathway through democracy, law, rights, media literacy, political systems, and respectful debate. Designed for specialists and non-specialists, it sequences essential knowledge, vocabulary, and dispositions in a way that builds confidence and civic readiness.

For leaders, the Spine strengthens curriculum intent, implementation, and impact by providing a trust-wide framework aligned with statutory Citizenship and Ofsted expectations. A sample is available for download; the full version is shared with MATs and schools upon enquiry.

5. Web of Lives: Values, Identity & PSHE Integration

Web of Lives strengthens the ecosystem by providing a structured, values-driven approach to identity, empathy, and personal development. Through narrative case studies, values cards, ideological thinkers, and reflective activities, pupils explore who they are and how they relate to others. This builds emotional intelligence, resilience, and respect.

Web of Lives integrates with PSHE, tutor time, assemblies, and English oracy, ensuring pupils encounter consistent messages about dignity, fairness, and respectful communication across the school day. It prepares pupils for the Real-World Complexity and Democratic Literacy pillars, ensuring discussions about rights and contemporary issues are grounded in empathy and understanding.

6. Safety & Restorative Practice

A calm, respectful school culture depends on staff confidence and consistent responses to harm. The Safety & Restorative Practice strand provides practical, legally aligned tools that support dignity, fairness, and accountability.

First Response to Discrimination

A structured approach for addressing discriminatory incidents in real time, including staff scripts, legal definitions, safeguarding prompts, and a 72-hour follow-up process.

De-escalation & Restorative Toolkit

Prompts, restorative questions, and templates that support calm, non-confrontational responses to conflict and help pupils repair relationships.

These tools reinforce Strategic Coherence by ensuring behaviour, safeguarding, and curriculum are aligned into one unified culture.

7. Ofsted Alignment

Quality of Education

Sequenced knowledge, consistent routines, and aligned PSHE and Citizenship.

Personal Development

Identity, values, rights, responsibilities, respectful relationships, and civic readiness.

Leadership and Management

Reduced risks, strengthened statutory compliance, and clear evidence of intent, implementation, and impact.
